Game Objective:

Three-Card Poker is two games consisting of the Ante and Raise and Pair Plus. The object in the Ante and Raise portion is to receive a higher 3-card poker hand than the Dealer. The object of the Pair Plus game is simply to bet on whether you will receive a 3-card poker hand with any pair or better. The Player may bet on either or both games for any amount within the posted table limit. The bets do not have to be equal amounts.

Game Rules:

- 1 Player makes an Ante and/or Pairplus bet
- 2 The dealer gives each player three cards and himself three cards. The player may examine his own cards. The dealer's cards are dealt face down.
- 3 If the player made the Ante bet, then he has must either fold or raise.
- 4 If the player folds, then he forfeits his Ante wager.
- 5 If the player raises, then he must make an additional Play bet, equal exactly to his Ante bet.
- 6 The dealer will turn over his cards.
- 7 The dealer needs a queen high or better to qualify.
- 8 If the dealer does not qualify then the player will win even money on the Ante bet and the Play bet will push.
- 9 If the dealer qualifies, then the player's hand will be compared to the dealer's hand, the higher hand wins. The order of poker hands is indicated below.
- 10 If the player has the higher poker hand then the Ante and Play will both pay even money.
- 11 If the dealer has the higher poker hand then the Ante and Play will both lose.
- 12 If the player and dealer tie then the Ante and Play bets will push.
- 13 If the player made the Ante bet and has a straight or higher then the player will receive an Ante Bonus, regardless of the value of the dealer's hand.

Method of Play (Three Ways To Play):

- (1) **Playing Against the Dealer**

? Player folds	LOSE
? When dealer does not play	PLAY is a PUSH ANTE wins 1 to 1
? When dealer plays and player's hand beats dealer's hand	PLAY wins 1 to 1 ANTE wins 1 to 1
? When dealer plays and dealer's hand beats player's hand	PLAY is a loss ANTE is a loss

The ANTE BONUS is paid when a player is dealt one of the three highest ranking hands in the game. **The ANTE BONUS is paid regardless of the dealer's hand.** The ANTE BONUS payouts are attached.

2Playing the Hand Value - PAIR PLUS

The object of betting the PAIR PLUS wager is to receive a pair or better. If the player's hand contains a pair or better the player wins the PAIR PLUS wager. **Players receive PAIR PLUS payouts regardless of the dealer's hand.** PAIR PLUS payouts are attached.

2Playing Both - PAIR PLUS and ANTE

When a player bets both the PAIR PLUS and the ANTE (including PLAY), he is playing against two separate paytables with two different criteria for payouts. In playing the ANTE wager, the object is to get a three-card poker hand that beats the dealer's qualifying hand of Queen or better. In playing the PAIR PLUS wager, the object is to receive a pair or better. **The ANTE and PAIR PLUS wagers do not have to be the same amount. Players receive the PAIR PLUS payouts regardless of the dealer's hand.** Players can wager anywhere from the table minimum to the maximum allowed bet on either spot. However, the PLAY wager must always equal the ANTE wager.

If the player has made the ANTE wager and the PAIR PLUS wager, he must make the PLAY wager or will forfeit both the ANTE and PAIR PLUS wagers.

Side bets between players are prohibited.

Dealing Procedures:

1. Each player makes a wager as indicated below, according to posted table limits:
 - ? To play against the dealer by placing an ANTE wager on the ANTE spot.
 - ? To play the hand value against the payable by placing a PAIR PLUS wager on the PAIR

PLUS spot.

- ? To play against the dealer and the payable by placing the ANTE wager on the ANTE spot and a PAIR PLUS wager on the PAIR PLUS spot.
- ? At the casino's discretion, a player may place wagers at two adjacent betting positions during a round of play.

2The dealer shall announce "No more bets" prior to the dealer dispensing any stacks of cards. Verbally acknowledge those players who have not made the PAIR PLUS wager. (Example: "No PAIR PLUS, position 2, 3 and 5.")

2Each player and the dealer receive three cards face down. Cards are delivered face down to the player from the dealer's left to right in rotation. To enhance game security, do not expose the bottom card.

2After examining his or her cards, the player has the option to either make a PLAY wager in the amount EQUAL to the player's ANTE wager, or forfeit the ANTE wager by folding. If a player has placed an ANTE wager and a PAIR PLUS wager but does not make a PLAY wager, the player forfeits both the ANTE wager and the PAIR PLUS wager.

2After each player has either placed a PLAY wager on the PLAY spot or folded, the dealer collects all forfeited wagers and cards.

2The dealer will arrange his hand from highest card value to the lowest, and announce, "Dealer doesn't play" or "Dealer plays with a Queen."

2The dealer will then reconcile the hands of those players who have not folded. Starting with the player on the dealer's right, bring the player's hand into the "work area" between the dealer's hand and the PAIR PLUS wager and reveal the player's cards. The dealer will pay and/or take from the back forwards, reconciling the PLAY wager first, the ANTE BONUS second, the ANTE wager third and the PAIR PLUS wager last. The dealer will lay and pay, or pick and pay, depending on casino procedures.

Irregularities in Dealing Procedures

- 1Incorrect number of cards in player's/dealer's hand.
2. If any player or the dealer is dealt an incorrect number of cards, all hands are void and the cards reshuffled.

Types of Wagers:

Ante; Play; Pair Plus

Wager Amounts: As Posted

Ante: \$1 minimum and maximum as allowed by law
Play: \$1 minimum and maximum as allowed by law
Pair Plus: \$1 minimum and maximum as allowed by law

Payout Table:

Pair Plus:
Straight Flush 40 to 1
Three of a Kind 30 to 1
Straight 5 to 1
Flush 3 to 1
Pair 1 to 1

Ante Bet:
Straight Flush 4 to 1
Three of a Kind 3 to 1
Straight 1 to 1

Play:
Pay 1 to 1

Payout table may be changed provided the changes are posted in a public place at the facility and provided to the RCGC.

House Rules:

▲ Before all tournaments, the Brush will announce the cost of the buy-in and any applicable re-buys/add-ons. Specific amounts are attached to the game schedule.

▲ Hourly tournaments interrupted by power failure or any other uncontrollable factor are automatically void unless only three players remain, in which case a determination of final position will be made based on each player's chip count.

- Multi-table tournaments will complete the hand if readable and agreeable to all players, otherwise the hand is dead. Remaining prize money will be evenly divided among all remaining players, regardless of chip count.

- Cash games and games of chance will complete the hand is readable and agreeable to all players. Otherwise, the hand is dead.

▲ Games of chance offer no refund. Chips purchased or won may be redeemed for face value and must be redeemed on the same day.

▲ Refunds will be given in tournaments prior to dealing the first card. In close call situations, and in fairness to other players, no refunds will be issued.

▲ As per RSA 287-D: 2-b, XI; each player may spend up to the amount allowed by law per tournament, except (RSA 287-D: 2-b, XII) the charity may offer one tournament per licensed

event in which each player may spend up to the amount allowed by law..

▲ Chips remain the property of Casablanca Casino LLC. and must be redeemed on the date of issue.

▲ The maximum bet on all games of chance is the amount allowed by RSA 287-D. The maximum bet on live (cash) poker games is the amount allowed by RSA 287-D. The number of raises permitted shall be determined by Casablanca Casino, LLC and posted in public view. There is no bet limit on tournament games where chips have no monetary value.

▲ All Games of Chance and Tournament Gaming areas are Non-Smoking. Smoking is permitted outside.

▲ A portion of the proceeds as required by RSA 287-D will be used to support the charity that sponsors the events of the day.
