MARCH

BINGO PARI RULE OF THE MONTH:

Pari 1007.06(d) - States that prior to the start of the first game of a bingo event, the charitable organization shall ensure that a public announcement is made letting players know where copies of the house rules are located and how copies can be obtained.

LUCKY 7 PARI RULE OF THE MONTH:

Pari 1106.03(b) - States that when Lucky 7 tickets are sold in conjunction with a bingo event, the tickets should only be sold between the hours of noon and 11pm on the day of the bingo event.

GAMES OF CHANCE LOT RULE OF THE MONTH:

Lot 7203.01(b)(2) - States that a charitable organization needs to be registered with the Secretary of State as a domestic non-profit authorized to do business in NH for 2 or more years prior to the application being submitted.



Please keep in mind, if you do not send an email within 24 hours of the closing, the organization will not receive a refund and it will count as a "game date used."

"TIMED" PROMOTIONS

The Commission would like to strongly encourage any game operator employer (GOE) that is offering a "timed" promotion, have the jackpot clock under video monitoring. This would be helpful should a player dispute arise, the GOE will have video to support any decision made. If a GOE does not have video verification, the decision will rule in favor of the disgruntled player.

BALANCING & CHECKING GAMING EQUIPMENT

The Commission is requesting that all GOE's routinely balance their roulette tables and verify that any other gaming equipment is in good working order. By keeping a log of such verification, this will ensure that you are compliant with Lot 7207.05(d)(1) – All equipment used in the conduct of a games of chance shall be maintained in good repair, and in sound working condition.

REQUIREMENTS FOR PLAYER-FUNDED PROMOTIONS


Player-funded promotions must comply with the requirements of Lot 7207.04(j). This includes the requirement that all funds be returned to players in the form of cash. A game operator cannot take a commission, charge an administrative fee, or pay prizes in food, merchandise or vouchers that cannot be exchanged for cash.

All player-funded game procedures must be submitted to the Commission prior to the promotion being offered. All game procedures must be written in a clear, complete and understandable manner, and include all of the information required by Lot 7206.07(c)(3). Please submit player-funded promotion game procedures to Josh Santos at Joshua.Santos@lottery.nh.gov.

Each game operator offering player-funded promotions must submit monthly financial reports to the auditing team at swc.lotteryauditors@lottery.nh.gov. These reports must include:

1. An activity report
2. Copies of all bank statements
3. The amount of cash on hand
4. A list of the names of each winner
