## **FAQ'S - STATE POLICE**

1. How long do you think it will take?

Answer: It depends, all Games of Chance applications require the completion of a State of New Hampshire and Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) record check. This process can take up to 60 days for completion which is why all applicants need to submit their paperwork at least 60 days prior to their current license expiration date.

2. Can I electronically sign and email you the documents?

Answer: No, State Police will reject the documents if they do not have original signatures and are copies.

3. I went to get my fingerprints done, had them scanned electronically but the individual that did my fingerprints did not give me a Livescan site form. What do I do?

Answer: Electronic fingerprints require a Livescan site form for processing. If you did not receive this form at your fingerprinting appointment, you will unfortunately have to go back to the place that took your fingerprints and ask for this form.

4. Can I pay with cash?

Answer: No, State Police will only accept a money order or a check. The current fee for a criminal background check is \$48.25 per person and this fee cannot be combined with the fee for your license or badge.


