Bad Beat Texas Hold Em Cash Jackpot Game Procedures

The "Cash Game Texas Hold Em Only Bad Beat Jackpot" is a prize that is paid out when two or more individuals are involved in a hand where at showdown, quad deuces or better are beaten by a higher ranking hand. When this occurs the total dollar amount posted that day as the bad beat jackpot amount is split amongst all active and remaining Texas Hold 'Em cash game participants in the cash game area where the Bad Beat hand occurred. The payout/split of the Bad Beat Jackpot and all other rules governing it are specified within the points of this document.

1. The Bad Beat shall apply to the game of Texas Hold'Em only. "Bad Beat" means a hand of quad deuces or better is beaten by a higher ranking hand (e.g., Four Deuces losing to Four Nines).
2. In order for a hand to be eligible to qualify for a Bad Beat, the pot must meet a minimum of \$20.
3. A minimum of four players must be seated and dealt in at the beginning of the hand in order to qualify for the Bad Beat. Only players that have registered with Seacoast Fundraising via a NoLimitsVIP players club card will be eligible for ANY bad beat payout. Pots won by all players seated at a Texas Hold'em cash game (eligible or not to receive a bad beat payout) will fund the Bad Beat Jackpot. There are no exceptions.
4. Only active players at table where bad beat is hit will be eligible for prize payouts. An active player is defined as a player who is current with blinds for current orbit. Players at other active cash tables are not eligible.
5. To qualify for the Bad Beat Jackpot, a player must have four Deuces or better beaten. If the winning or losing player has made a Four-of-a-Kind, that player must have a pocket pair to qualify (example: if a player has four Eights, he/she must have a pocket pair of Eights with two Eights on the board).
6. Both the winning and losing hands must use both of their hole cards to create the highest possible hand. If Four Deuces or better are beaten then 100% of displayed Bad Beat Jackpot Amount will be paid out as per rule #13.
7. A \$1 maximum amount will be removed from each pot according to Rule #2. If it is a rake game, the \$20 or more includes the rake.
8. In order for a hand to be eligible for the Bad Beat Jackpot, the pot must meet the minimum requirement for that game limit. The hand must go to a showdown

(played to the end, where all cards have been dealt and players have completed betting and show their cards to determine the winner) in order for the jackpot to be awarded.

9. On a daily basis, for each \$1 collected, 80% will be added to the Bad Beat Jackpot Bank and the remainder (20%) will be held in a reserve bank to replenish the Bad Beat Jackpot, when hit. These two banks will be treated as the player's property and held in a separate checking account. The size of the Bad Beat Jackpot and reserve banks will be posted daily. No more or less than 100% of the Bad Beat Jackpot monies deposited will be allocated for all current and future Bad Beat Jackpots.

10. If a hand finishes with three qualifying hands, the lowest hand will only receive a player's share of the jackpot (e.g., Four Eights, Four Queens and a Queen High Straight Flush are dealt in the same hand. The Bad Beat hand will be the Four Queens and the winning hand will be the Queen High Straight Flush.)

11. Players must play their hands independently. Any discussion of the prize during the playing of the hand may void qualification for the Bad Beat Jackpot. If any player, whether directly or indirectly involved in the hand, passes information or instructs another on how to act or reveals his/her hand to other players, the Bad Beat Jackpot will be disqualified.

12. Management reserves the right to verify eligibility of all qualifying hands. There will be no recourse if the cards are mucked before surveillance was able to verify the hands and the community cards.

13. Poker management will not be permitted to reconstruct the hands in any way. In order to collect any Seacoast Fundraising/The Poker Room @ One Lafayette Bad Beat Jackpot payout, proper identification will be required.

14. Payouts of the Bad Beat Jackpot are listed below. These payouts will be posted. Any and all changes to these percentages will be effective @ the start of the new effective date.

- 40% of the Bad Beat Jackpot will be awarded to the Bad Beat hand (losing hand)
- 20% of the Bad Beat Jackpot will be awarded to the winner of the hand
- 40% of the Bad Beat Jackpot will be awarded equally among the balance of the seated players with chips in ONLY the table where bad beat is hit.

15. A player who revokes his/her chips from the game prior to a showdown on a hand where a Bad Beat is won, forfeits his/her right to any prize money.

16. A player who walks away from the game, but leaves his/her chips on the table AND he/she was in the hand at the beginning, will retain rights to his/her share of the Bad Beat Jackpot if a Bad Beat hand occurs.

17. Winners will be solely responsible for all taxes. Each winner will be required to provide a current valid ID to collect any winnings. Prizes are non-transferable. US citizens will be issued a W2G on winnings of \$1200 or more. Players from foreign countries will be issued a 1042-S and they will generally be subject to a US income tax withholding of 30% regardless of the amount of the payout. Any player unable to provide a valid SSN will be subject to 30% withholding.

18. Prizes won are final. No substitution or transfer of prizes permitted.

19. In the rare occurrence of a Bad Beat Jackpot being hit on more than one game at the same time, surveillance will be contacted to determine the actual winner, verify whether the High or Low jackpot was hit, and then the jackpot will be distributed on each game according to the percentages set forth in Rule #10 above.

20. Decisions of the Poker Room Supervisor are final and without recourse.

21. By participating in the Seacoast Fundraising/The Poker Room @ One Lafayette Bad Beat Jackpot, winners consent to the use of their names and photographs for promotional purposes without additional compensation.

22. In the event (1) Seacoast Fundraising decides to halt the Texas Hold Em Cash Bad Beat Jackpot or (2) Seacoast Fundraising moves its location from One Lafayette Rd Hampton Falls, NH any and all monies held by Seacoast Fundraising for the Texas Hold Em Cash Bad Beat Jackpot will be awarded via a drawing. All players contributing funds to the current Texas Hold Em Cash Bad Beat Jackpot from the next day of the last paid Texas Hold Em Cash Bad Beat Jackpot will be given one entry to the drawing. This will be determined via player registration in all cash games via No Limits VIP card. All players qualifying for an entry into the drawing will be posted on Seacoast Fundraising's website. The date and time of the drawing will be posted on Seacoast Fundraising's website. The winner must be present at the time of the drawing to claim their prize. A name will be drawn every five minutes until a winner claims the award.

Hold 'em Only Bad Beat Jackpot

Seacoast fundraising LLC runs a bad beat jackpot in compliance with approved game procedure 11-005. The Hold'em High Hand procedures will not change our compliance with the approved game procedures of game #11-005.

Rule 9, currently reads "On a daily basis, for each \$1 collected, 80% will be added to the Bad Beat Jackpot Bank and the remainder (20%) will be held in a reserve bank to replenish the Bad Beat Jackpot, when hit. These two banks will be treated as the players' property and held in a separate checking account. The size of the Bad Beat Jackpot and reserve banks will be posted daily. No more or less than 100% of the Bad Beat Jackpot monies deposited will be allocated for all current and future Bad Beat Jackpots.

We would like to make the following changes to rule #8, changes are in bold:

On a daily basis, for each \$1 collected, **40% will be added to the Bad Beat Jackpot and 10% will be held in reserve to replenish the Bad Beat Jackpot, when hit.** Any extra whole dollar will be added to the Bad Beat Jackpot bank. These two banks, will be treated as the players' property and held in a separate checking account. The size of the Bad Beat Jackpot and reserve banks will be posted daily. No more or less than 100% of the Bad Beat Jackpot monies deposited will be allocated for all current and future Bad Beat Jackpots.

The Remaining 50% collected will be held as a separate bank called the Hold'em High Hand Jackpot. This bank will be treated as the players' property and will be held in a separate checking account. No more or less than 100% of the Hold'em High Hand Jackpot monies deposited will be allocated for all current and future Hold'em High Hand Jackpot promotions and payouts.

Hold'em High Hand Jackpot payouts will be awarded through a series of High Hand promotions which will be posted at The PokerRoom and on

ThePokerRoomnh.com. Players must be present and actively playing any Hold'em cash game when payouts are awarded.

Hold'em High Hand Jackpot hands must fulfill all standards of our Bad Beat Jackpot in order to qualify for any payout, with the exception that a showdown at the river is not necessary for a winning hand.

Example: \$249 dollars are collected on a business day for the Hold'em Bad Beat Jackpot.

\$100 (40%) to Hold'em Bad Beat Jackpot.

\$25 (10%) to the Hold'em Bad Beat Jackpot reserve.

\$124 (50%) To Hold'em High Hand Jackpot.

Seacoast Fundraising LLC, will be capping the “Hold’em only Bad Beat Jackpot” (HOBBJ) when the posted payout amount exceeds \$25,000.

Currently, the daily collection for the HOBBJ is divided in two. Half of the collection, funds the HOBBJ and its reserve account, the other half is deposited into a separate account to be used to fund Hold’em cash games’ promotions and High Hand payouts.

When the posted payout amount of the HOBBJ exceeds \$25,000, 100% of the daily collection will be added to the Hold’em cash game High Hand and promotion account.

Example: If the posted payout amount was \$24,700 and the collection amount was \$1000, then \$500 (\$400 toward posted pay out, (\$100 to reserve) will go toward HOBBJ, and \$500 will go toward Hold’em cash game High Hand and promotion account. The HOBBJ posted payout amount is now \$25,100. 100% of future HOBBJ collections will be deposited into the Hold’em cash game High Hand and promotions account.

When the HOBBJ gets hit, and drops below \$25,000, the collections will be split in two to fund both the HOBBJ and Hold’em cash game High Hand and promotions.
