After a review of your proposal the New Hampshire Lottery Commission (NHLC) has administratively granted approval for your organization to operate the game as presented, and described in "Exhibit A" attached hereto, which is incorporated by reference. The approval contained is solely applicable to Kymalimi, LLC DBA Chasers Poker Room.

All approved games shall be conducted in accordance with rules and regulations applicable to the NHLC (RSA 287-D, Pari 1200). The NHLC does not represent, warrant or otherwise assert that the GOC, known as "Three Card Poker" and the operation of "Three Card Poker" does not violate any intellectual property right, including, but not limited to, any agreement, license, copyright, trademark or patent right. The NHLC assumes no liability for damages incurred, directly or indirectly, as a result of errors, omissions, and/or discrepancies occasioned by the aforesaid intellectual property right violations.

This GOC is not assignable or otherwise transferable. Any other person or entity seeking to operate the GOC, known as "Three Card Poker" #17 010, must make application thereof to the New Hampshire Lottery Commission.

3 Card Poker

Equipment

3 Card Poker is used on a clearly designated non-poker table with appropriate layout.

One standard 52 Playing Card Deck is used for this game.

A discard rack is used for this game to remove cards previously used.

A Non-value unique token will be used to designate and secure players playing multiple hands.

Dealing procedures:

- Prior to the start of the hand, dealers will ensure that all players have placed an ante wager or a pair plus wager.
- Cards will be dealt left to right. One by one (including dealer) and placed NOT pitched. Cards should be staggered and placed to the front left (Dealers left) of the player's wagers. Dealers cards should be directly on top of each other only exposing the back of one of the 3 cards. Dealers Cards should remain on top of each other until hand is exposed.
- Dealers should muck stub in discard rack once all cards are out.
- Dealers should place cut card on top of their hand until hand is exposed.
- Players are not allowed to touch any cards until the conclusion of the deal and remaining stub is in the discard rack. Dealer will indicate this by opening a hand or giving verbal permission. Please be polite and firm on this. There are a lot of cards in play per hand, game protection is extremely important.

Players **MAY** play up to 2 Hands. Floor Approval is required and a token or object must be placed on hands that are not in use. A player playing 2 hands or more may never look at more than one hand at a time. Any player playing 2 or more hands must perform all decisions on current hand prior to playing their next hand.

Any player playing 2 hands will surrender one of those hands if a new player is wishing to play if there are no more available spots to play. New players always have priority.

Round of Play

Each player shall examine his/ her cards.

After examination of the cards, each player who has placed an Ante wager shall have the option to either make a Play wager in an amount equal to the player's Ante wager or forfeit the Ante wager and end his or her participation in the round of play. The dealer shall offer this option to each player, starting with the player to the left of the dealer and moving clockwise around the table in order. Players should be instructed to put cards under the play wager indicated by the layout. Once the play wager is placed on top of cards, players may no longer have access to their hands.

If a player has placed a Pair Plus wager, but does not make a Play wager, (Folding) the player shall forfeit only the Ante wager.

After each player has either placed a wager on the table in the Play area or forfeited his/ her wager and hand, the dealer shall collect all forfeited wagers first and associated cards, placing them in the discard rack.

The dealer shall then reveal the dealer's hand and place the cards in the highest possible ranking hand. The dealer must qualify to play with a minimum of queen-high.

If the dealer does NOT qualify: The Play wager receives no action.

If the player did not fold the player shall be paid even money on their Ante Wager. Players will also get paid their Ante Bonus if applicable.

If the dealer's hand qualifies: If the player's hand beats the dealer's hand, the player wins even money play wager and at least even money on the ante wager. (See Ante Bonus Pay table)

If the dealer's hand beats the player's hand, the player loses both the Ante and the Play wagers.

If the player's hand and the dealer's hand are equal in rank and value, the hand is considered a tie and the Ante and Play wagers shall push and be returned to the player.

The dealer shall then reveal the three-card hand of each active player, starting with player to the right of the dealer.

Paying Out:

When dealers are analyzing players winning and losing bets, dealers will always go from bets closest to the player and work up away from the player.

Dealers will take losing bets from the current player in order of Play, Ante, Pair Plus, and 6 Card Bonus.

Dealers will then pay out winning bets from the current player in order of Play, Ante, Pair Plus, and 6 Card Bonus.

When paying out, dealers should cut out all payouts in front of table bank clearly and transparently so that surveillance, the players and a supervisor (If need) can verify. The Dealer should then stack up and place to the right of each winning wager the appropriate amount.

All cards collected by the dealer shall be picked up by taking the front card of the player and scoop the remaining two cards. Dealers are to place player cards in the discard rack in such a way that they can be readily arranged to reconstruct each hand in the event of a question or dispute.

PAIR PLUS - Wager

Players may choose to only play the Pair Plus Wager. Players who play only the pair plus wager may NOT look at their hand. Dealers are to tuck cards underneath pair plus wager to signal that player has no decisions to make. Players may play 6 card bonus if playing Pair Plus Wager. Pair Plus wager is the contents of the players 3 card hand.

6 Card Bonus – Wager

To play the 6 Card Bonus, players must have an active wager on the Pair Plus Wager AND/OR an Ante wager. 6 Card bonus wager is the combination of players 3 cards and dealer 3 cards to make the best 5 card poker hand.
